We have been lucky so far this winter by having very nice weather. Unfortunately I think that our fair weather is coming to an end and we must prepare to deal with harsher conditions. Make sure that you prepare your homes and vehicles for the winter weather. Vehicles need to be checked for anti-freeze levels, battery condition, tire pressure, and windshield wiper fluid. It is also a good idea to carry some emergency items in your vehicle such as warm clothing/blankets and some snacks and water in case you should be stranded due to bad weather or a break down. Also make sure that your homes are winterized as necessary and that any exposed plumbing is insulated against the cold. A few small precautions can go a long way towards preventing serious trouble.

We've all heard people exclaim that "if I had a dollar for every time I've _____", well here's mine for the month. If I had a dollar for every collision I've worked that was caused by someone who didn't clean the frost/snow off of their car windows!

Please, please, please take the time to adequately clean off your car windows before you drive down the street. Do not put yourself and/or others in danger for the sake of convenience.

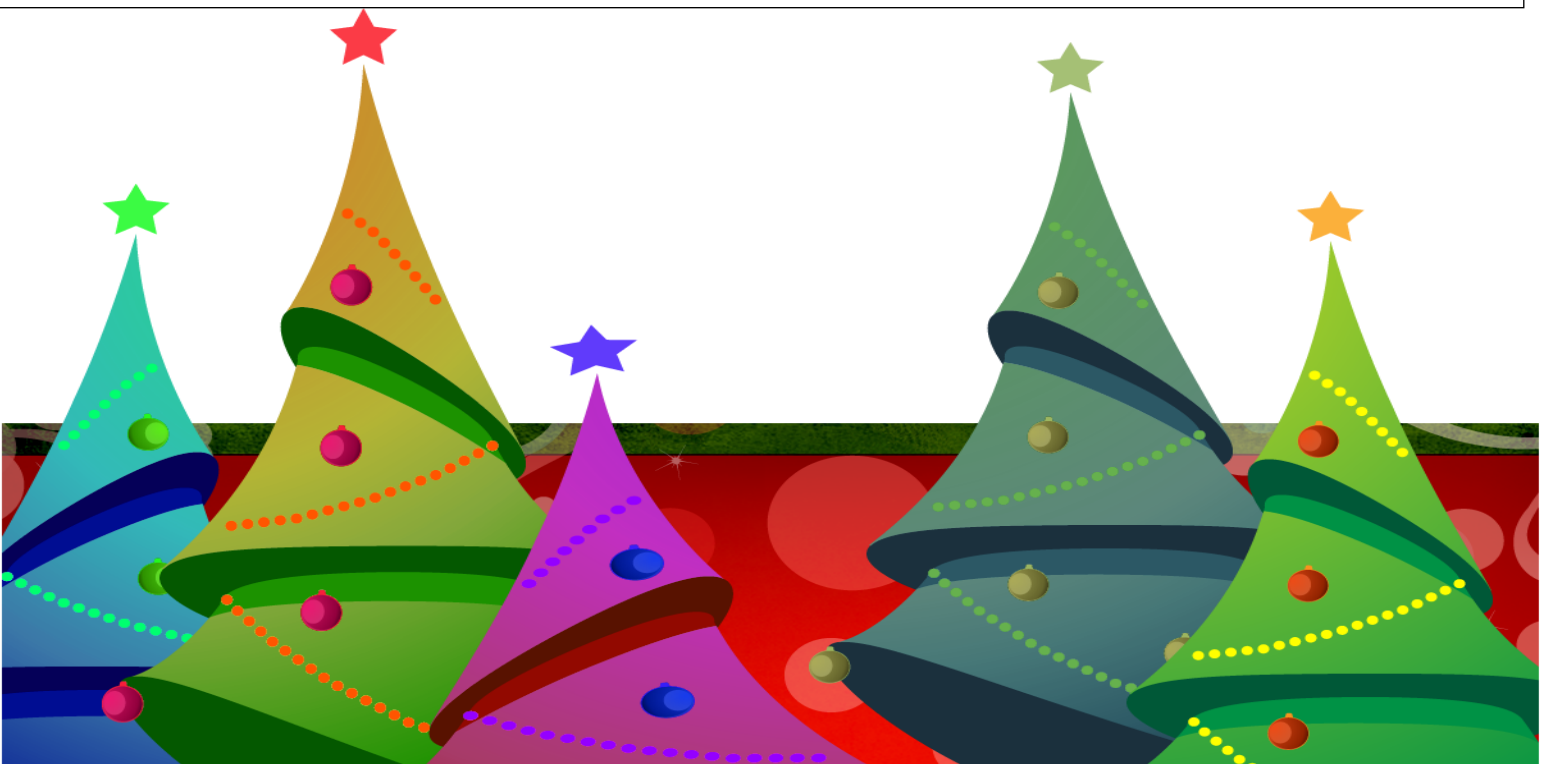

Winter Safety Tips

Be sure your loved one wears the correct footwear, wearing shoes and boots that are not worn out and still provide good traction on the heels and soles and also include special anti-skid materials to prevent slips and falls.

Keep the sidewalks and driveways clear of ice; have someone blow or shovel the snow away as needed, apply de-icing material such as salt to reduce the ice buildup on walkways.

Be sure the steps leading up to the house are in good repair and are not weak or wobbly as they will be even more difficult to navigate safely when there may be snow, water and ice buildup.

Be careful when walking on snow covered walkways.

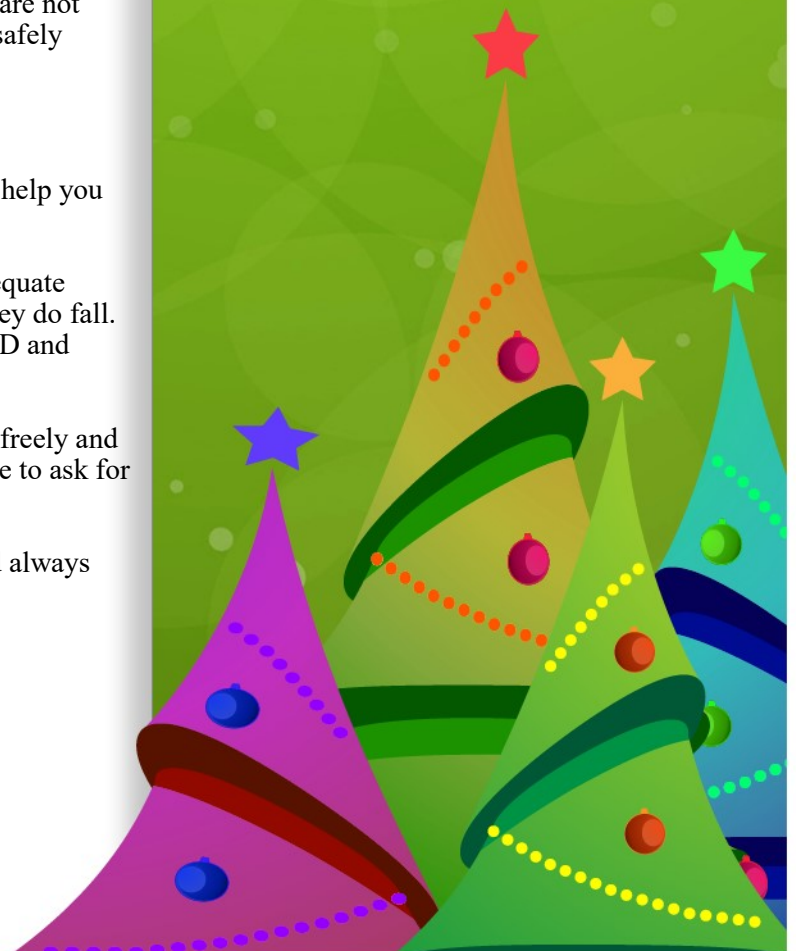
Be sure all walkways have a steady handrail that can be used to help you keep your balance.

Remind your loved ones to eat foods or take supplements in adequate amounts that will keep their bones strong to prevent breaks if they do fall. These supplements may include those such as calcium, vitamin D and dairy products — or whatever their doctors recommend.

Stay active all year to maintain the muscles that will help move freely and maintain balance on all walking surfaces, especially ice. Be sure to ask for help if needed.

Prepare for an emergency if you do fall. Who will you call, and always carry your cell phone.

Prevention takes a little planning.

November 12, 2015 Minutes

After review of the draft copy of the minutes, Commissioner Nichols made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Eskridge and carried unopposed.

Police Report

Police Chief Griffin reported the following;

November Highlights

- All officers completed KLC recommended monthly training,
- The listed offense report references a break-in to a vehicle at East Chase Apartments,
- No issues reported during Black Friday weekend,
- All businesses in the shopping centers checked daily,
- Golden Watch residents checked on weekly,
- Explorer and Impala are in good working order.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Sharon Hollkamp read the monthly treasurer's report for November, 2015 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner Eskridge made a motion to accept as reported. Commissioner Renninger seconded the motion which then carried unanimously.

Warrants

Treasurer Sharon Hollkamp read the warrants for November, 2015 and copies were made available for all people in attendance. After a discussion, Commissioner McAllister made a motion to accept as reported. Commissioner Renninger seconded the motion which carried with no opposing vote.

Attorney's Report

In Attorney Emery's absence Andrew Howell discussed the wall maintenance issue at Taylorhurst. All efforts so far to locate a document that outlines the responsibility of Taylorhurst have been unsuccessful. The engineer that Taylorhurst hired to assess the condition told Commissioner McAllister that the wall is not a danger. Our attorney will be contacting John Frith Stewart's paralegal at the time the document would have been created for further information.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks

Commissioner Eskridge reported that under the monthly check list, no safety concerns were found in the Park. The swing sets that were reordered have been received and installed. The Do's & Don't's park application list was handed out to the Commission and several items were discussed. For the first item, the use fee, it was decided to eliminate the fee generally. However, a damage deposit may be required for 'special events', groups over 25, or business entities. Another item discussed involved prohibited activities including 'inflatables', alcohol use, and 'open fire'. Finally, it was agreed that a sign will be posted in the park outlining rules and regulations. For any situation requiring a permit, all signed documents will be obtained by the Park Commissioner with the permit issued by the Clerk.

Sanitation

Commissioner McAllister suggested that the 2014 City Audit should be included on the City website. He also mentioned that Ordinance #5, Series 2012 needs to be revised. Mayor Fore stated that the first reading of the revised ordinance will be held in January, 2016. After discussing the invoice from the accountant that Commissioner McAllister had hired to review the City's accounting procedures, the Commission agreed to pay the \$125. Finally, he mentioned that there is an upcoming program to certify a City's Ethics Committee. Mayor Fore asked Commissioner McAllister to mention it to the Ethics Committee Chairman, Doug Rogers.

Roads

Commissioner Nichols is still in the process of surveying the residents along Blowing Tree to determine whether to remove the speed bumps there. Resident Jim Lynch asked about the painting of the median on Bunsen Way. Commissioner Nichols said that she would contact the State.

Police

Commissioner Renninger reported that she met with representatives from a new restaurant coming to our City, 'El Nopal'. She advised them that until they are close to opening, an ABC license cannot be issued.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Gift to Residents

After talking with a representative from the City of Shively, Mayor Fore concluded that a similar monetary gift to residents in our City would not be legal. To help clarify whether the previous determination came from KLC or the Attorney General's office, Attorney Howell was asked to have Steve Emery research and report back next month.

There being no further business or discussion, the meeting was adjourned.
