TIPS from the KY Office of Highway Safety

The KOHS provides the following tips for dealing with speeding and/or aggressive drivers:

- Wear your seat belt! It is your best defense against injury and death.
- Do not challenge the driver by speeding up or attempting to hold your lane.
- Give them plenty of space, as they may lose control of their vehicle more easily.
- Avoid eye contact and ignore gestures.
- If you can safely report an aggressive driver to law enforcement, provide a vehicle description, license number, location and, if possible, direction of travel.
- If an aggressive driver is following you, drive to a safe place such as the nearest police or fire station, gas station or other areas where there are people. Use your horn to get someone's attention. Do not get out of your car and do not drive home.

June 9 Minutes

Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept the minutes as published. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bohnenkamp and carried unopposed.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer John Bloomer outlined the June report. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to accept. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Nichols which carried unanimously. Treasurer Bloomer also confirmed that we should hear something by the end of next Friday about the audit.

Warrants

Treasurer John Bloomer outlined the warrants for June. Commissioner Renninger made a motion to approve. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Nichols and carried unanimously.

Police Report

Police Chief Griffin reported the following for June:

June Highlights:

- All officers completed KLC recommended monthly training.
- The three offense reports were for a death investigation at the Meadows Apartments, a found property at Welch Park and an assault at Speedway.
- All Golden Watch residents checked on weekly.
- All businesses in shopping centers checked on daily.
- The Taurus is currently in the shop with an electrical issue, all other vehicles are in good working order.

Attorney's Report

Though Attorney Baker could not be at the meeting, she left the following report to be included in the minutes; she has received no response from Hagan Properties or Puppy Gram regarding the pet shop. It is recommended that a letter be sent to Hagan Properties informing them that the business must be removed within the next 30 days, or the City will file suit to enforce the private deed restriction. Attorney Baker has also received no response from the Meadows Apartments concerning our offer to accept the easement. She did learn that the property was in the process of being sold, but it does not change anything. It is her recommendation that the City go ahead and file a motion to set a jury trial to establish the amount we owe for simple title to the property.

Introduction of Finn Cato

Attorney Finn Cato expressed his interest in becoming our city attorney once Attorney Baker starts her new responsibilities in January, 2023. He outlined his career accomplishments and is currently the attorney for several other cities within Louisville Metro. The Commission is in the process of searching for Attorney Baker's replacement.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Park

With Commissioner Eskridge on vacation, he had nothing specific to report for the meeting.

Sanitation

Commissioner Bohnenkamp said seven households have contacted her about the need for new trash bins/toters. She has passed on this information to EcoTech. She continues to notify residents, both in the newsletter and Reach Alert, when pickup days are pushed back due to holidays. Otherwise, it has been quiet.

Streets

Commissioner Nichols advised that she is working with resident and newsletter editor, Kim Bloomer, regarding holiday decorations. She believes that two more electrical outlets could be

used in the Park and is getting estimates for those installations.

In other news, she noticed a large sign had been erected on Cardwell Way which asked drivers to slow down due to children at play. As a result, she has ordered a 'Children at Play' sign for Cardwell Way. Once that sign is ready, she will have it installed, along with two other signs requiring that dogs be on a leash at the end of Blowing Tree Road and Bristol Avenue.

Lastly, Commissioner Nichols and Kim Bloomer have decided that they would only buy 'local' specifically related to the holiday decorations.

Police

Commissioner Renninger reported that all the businesses have their ABC license with the exception of Chuck E Cheese. She has also been working with BoomBozz concerning a sign on the side of the building facing Liquor Outlet for compliance with city ordinances. The new opening date is now August 15.

There being no further business or discussion the meeting was adjourned.
